

General Information



Seneca County Sheriff's sales of foreclosed real estate are held on Thursday mornings at 10:00 A.M. in the lobby of the Seneca County Sheriff's Office, located at 3040 S. State Route 100 in Tiffin.

Sale notices are published in the Tiffin Advertiser Tribune and the Fostoria Review Times, depending on what area of the County the property is located in. The ads are published typically on Thursdays for a minimum of three consecutive weeks.

The property still belongs to the original owner even though the order of sale has been issued from the court. If you purchase a property at Sheriff's Sale, and have submitted a deposit, it still belongs to the original owner until the Common Pleas Judge has signed the confirmation of sale. This process may take up to 30 days or more. If you have any questions regarding this you should contact your personal attorney before any real estate purchase from a Sheriff Sale. **WE CANNOT ADVISE YOU OF ANY LEGAL QUESTIONS YOU MAY HAVE.**

ENTERING THE PROPERTY WITHOUT THE PERMISSION OF THE OWNER OR OCCUPANTS IS A VIOLATION OF OHIO REVISED CODE SECTION 2911.21. PUNISHABLE UP TO 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND A \$250.00 FINE.
